Language Requirements	PUCPR does not have a language proficiency requirement. But we suggest that the
	student have a knowledge in Portuguese or English according to their academic goals.
Course Load and Required student workload per semester (credits)	PUCPR has its own credit system and it is important to note that this system only takes into consideration the in-class hours, differently from the ECT system that counts the subject's workload and the students' individual hours of study. Therefore:
	Theoretical classes – 20 contact hours = 1 PUC credit Practical classes – 40 contact hours = 1 PUC credit Our theoretical subjects can vary from 40 contact hrs (2 hrs per week) to 80 contact hrs (4 hrs per week) and our practical classes can vary from 40 to 144 hrs per semester.
	Consequently, a full-time student attending around 360 – 420 hours per semester would get roughly 20 PUC credits, which is equivalent to around 30 ECTS. International students also need to take Portuguese as a Second Language class, which is worth 5 ECTS, therefore a semester at PUCPR is equivalent to around 35 ECTS.
	15 hours at PUCPR is equivalent 1 ECTS
Subject Selection	Students pre-select the subjects in the application form (study plan). During the orientation week, the students meet the academic course coordinator to finalize the study plan.
Grading System	Range: 0,0 – 10,0 Passing Grade: 7,0 Minimum passing grade after final exam: 5,0 Mandatory class attendance: 75%
In case of failing, students can take the final exam	Final exams are only applicable to students with 75% of attendance in class and have a final grade higher than 4,0 (in a scale of 0,0 to 10,0). Students whose final grades are less than 4,0 will not be able to take the final exam and will have failed the course regardless of the attendance.
When will the transcript be released?	The transcript of records will be issued in the end of the academic semester, as soon as our office receives the grades from the Registrar's office.
	INTERNATIONAL EXCHANGE STUDENTS INFORMATION
Orientation Dates	The orientation happens 1 week before the beginning of the academic semester. Students are notified beforehand of the exact dates and location. The orientation session offers the opportunity to learn about the university processes, meet with the course coordinator and learn about all the support services offered. Therefore, attendance is MANDATORY.
Student Visa - VITEM IV (MANDATORY)	All international students who don't have a Brazilian passport need to get a student visa (VITEM IV) to study at PUCPR. Students should check in the Brazilian Consulate/Embassy website from the country of origin the list of documents required for the visa application. One of the required documents is the Acceptance Letter, which will be provided by PUCPR after receiving and processing the application form. For the visa to be granted, all students must have a valid passport. Once the students receive the student visa, they must send us a copy by email. PUCPR will only pre-enroll the students upon the presentation of a copy of their student visa.
Health Insurance Requirements (MANDATORY)	All international students must purchase a health insurance with a coverage for the duration of the staying in Brazil. It must be purchased before leaving their home countries. The health insurance costs varies, in some countries, the visa is only issued presenting the health insurance.
Medical Assistance	PUCPR does not have medical services on campus but we can easily refer the students to doctors, clinics and hospitals.

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Accommodation	There is no on-campus housing available at PUCPR. We provide a list of off-campus options/suggestions and give the appropriate guidance regarding local leasing procedures and policies. The list is available to the students as soon as they are admitted at PUCPR to start their travel arrangements.
Estimated cost for accommodation monthly	Accommodation: BRL 800,00 – 1.500,00 (monthly)

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION OF SERVICES OFFERED BY PUCPR	
Portuguese Classes (Mandatory – free of charges)	It is offered during the semester in 4 (four) different levels: beginner, basic, intermediate and advance (total of 80 hours – 5 ECTS credits) – concurrently with academic courses. Students are placed in the most appropriate level after a placement test taken during the Orientation Session.
Intensive Portuguese Program (Optional)	It is offered twice a year, during the winter and summer terms with duration of 3 weeks with Intensive Portuguese Training and cultural activities.
Sports Center	International students have free access to one of the available sports activities: fitness center or swimming pool.
Community Project	Students can be involved in our community projects, those activities can be developed in retirement homes; hospitals; local need community. The activity hours will be informed in the transcript of records after the conclusion.
Research - PIBIC International	Students have the opportunity to be involved in academic research with our professors, and be granted with a scholarship. Special calls are open every semester in different areas and the students interested in applying to PIBIC need to register for the program and pass through the selection process. Research is a great opportunity to have a contact with studies' theory.
Clubes Universitários	The objective of the <i>Clubes Universitarios</i> project is to stimulate the creation of groups of students at PUCPR.
